She has contributed to tri-council grants, including as co-PI on a gender diversity CIHR planning and dissemination grant and as co-investigator for several translational heart failure related research. She has experience on heart failure related clinical trials and studies, registry development, and biochemistry, physiology, and cell biology studies. She has served additionally as teaching assistant, research mentor and lecturer in biochemistry, medicine, dentistry, and graduate studies courses.
